

Bibliography

Section A contains the works of Lacan and the *compte-rendus* of his seminars by J. B. Pontalis; Section B, those items in which he collaborated with others; Section C, items dealing with Lacan and items by authors employing or commenting on Lacanian themes. Section D includes a brief list of items of relevance to the *Discours de Rome* as well as works referred to by the translator. An attempt has been made to provide as complete a bibliography of Lacan as possible, including items not published in a regular format or otherwise unobtainable, and including items of primarily therapeutic or psychiatric interest. However, a number of items previous to 1930 have been left out, and it should be noted that the bulk of Lacan's seminars during sixteen years of commentary on Freud have never been published.

Items preceded by an asterisk will be found in: Jacques Lacan, *Ecrits* (Paris: Editions du Seuil, 1966). This collection includes a series of "introductions" bridging the gaps between the various texts (which are carefully arranged in nonchronological order); some of the texts reprinted in it are slightly modified from their original form or include explanatory notes added in 1966. Four of the articles had not been previously published.
